

HOW YOU CAN STAR IN OUR ADVENT

JOURNEY Reverend Ian Maslin wants to see our village illuminated with stars of all kinds this Advent. Advent Sunday is next weekend, November 29, and during the four weeks leading up to Christmas Reverend Ian hopes we will all put a star prominently in our windows at home or on our boundary fences as we join a campaign that is taking off around these parts. The stars can be made from lights or drawn or coloured in. In fact, he hopes all age groups will take part and the more imaginative your star, the better. The idea is that with every star placed during Advent we bring a bit of the light of Christmas into our village and spread some Christian cheer as we round off a challenging 2020. It's fun but there is a deeper Christian message as we look to follow the star to our own special Christmas night. And Reverend Ian plans to walk around our village during Advent to see how many stars have appeared and if one grabs his attention he'll take a photo, and with the owner's permission, put it onto his Twitter account and our church website. As well as launching our Advent stars campaign Reverend Ian will also be introducing an Advent course that will run as four zoom conference sessions starting on Advent Sunday (November 29) at 6.30 pm. The sessions will run for approximately 30 minutes and will consist of some Advent readings and reflections covering four topics: The Doorkeeper, Preparing the Way, Witnessing to the Light and Saying Yes to God. Everyone is welcome. We will send out the zoom link to you nearer the launch

date.

She helped Friends of Hascombe, the fete and the harvest suppers. She also got people together over meals and for tennis and bridge. She was persuasive and enthusiastic.

She and Roger were good to me after my darling wife died and I much enjoyed tennis and bridge at Foxbury Meadow. I miss them.

I am sure that you will have other memories of her in Hascombe where I think she did come to church although she was attracted to Shalford, where she lived before. Sad news. Charles Orange.
