NO DINING OUT BUT IT'S TIME TO BACK THE BISHOP OF GUILDFORD'S LENT APPEAL

The Bishop of Guildford's Communities Fund supports the vulnerable and marginalised throughout the diocese, helping those parishes and charities which are reaching out into their local communities.

The Bishop of Guildford, Andrew Watson is asking parishes and individuals to dig deep and consider how we can help the Fund to continue their vital work.

Our joint initiative with Hascombe Church has been one of the diocese's most generous in recent years via our popular Lent lunches. This year's lockdown means we can't stage the lunches so we are simply asking for the most generous display of your support yet.

In his excellent book for Lent, Come and See, the Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell (right), writes: "It has often been said that the last part of a human being to be converted is his wallet! Whether we like it or not, the way we spend our money speaks very eloquently of our priorities.

"To put it bluntly, if we spend more money each year on a daily newspaper, or on alcohol or evenings out or holidays, than on supporting the life of the church or supporting the charities to alleviate suffering in the world, then very clearly those things take a higher priority in our lives than God.

"Generosity is not measured by how much we give, but by how much we have left after we have given."

We've been blessed by some generous donations so far this Lent and we've raised just over £2000 for the Bishop's Appeal. That's a great start but we humbly ask, if you've not yet made a donation, to support our campaign so we can set a new record for Dunsfold and Hascombe.
