

Explore the Diocese

The Diocese of Guildford was formed in 1927 from part of the ancient Diocese of Winchester. Guildford Cathedral, dedicated to The Holy Spirit and built between 1936 and 1961, is one of only two British Anglican cathedrals to be built on a new site since the C16th Reformation - Liverpool is the other.

The Diocese covers an area of about 500 square miles, including most of Surrey and North East Hants, and touches on West Sussex and Outer London, with a population of more than a million people. The Diocese shares boundaries with the Dioceses of London, Southwark, Chichester, Portsmouth, Winchester and Oxford.

EE Telecommunications Mast
Hascombe Estates have agreed Heads of Terms with WHP Telecoms. The lease is being negotiated with the solicitors at this time. WHP Telecoms will actually need to resubmit the planning application as they have reassessed the height of the surrounding trees following a survey, and will need an additional 5m of height in order to clear the foliage and provide the required level of signal.
