week? Well, the plant pots and the compost and the seedlings and all the rest of it sat on the dining room		
table for a week, until my wife got fed up with the

	something. I did not catch it exactly	
– I was preparing a sermon at the time. Anyway,		
fortunately, my daughter came to the rescue, and		
helped me plant all	the things in the right pots	

and the right potholders, with the right handfuls of dirt and gravel scattered all over the dining room. ("Dad, I think we should have done this outside!" Etc.)

Of course, finding the right compost and gravel for the right pot, for the right potholder, for the right plant, was a study in ergonomics all to itself. Which I duly failed, hence the need for help. Aforementioned daughter took a dim view of general pathetic-ness of Dad trying to 'Do Something Simple', but that's OK, I am used to it. And she did, after all, help.

The tropical plants are now looking very thoughtful in their new pots in the study and are probably reflecting on the whole nature and challenge of 'change'. Aren't we all. The foxglove seeds are steaming up nicely in their electric propagator, and I am wondering if they're going to really get going, because it says, plant in April, and I was too busy in April.

How does anyone or anything grow with all these handicaps and restrictions? It's a miracle to me. Maybe no one told the wildflowers they ought properly to find the right pot, and the right soil, and the right time of year. Maybe they just figured it all out all by themselves.

More news on that soon, but in the meantime there's lots more exciting developments coming up in September. First of all, we have our **second family service** at Dunsfold on the 4th September, and then, on Dunsfold Common, we have a **joint pet service** at 10 am on the 11th September. This will be a big set piece for us, and a fantastic way of connecting further with the villages. Do please come and support these new initiatives, as well, of course, all our other regular services.

Then, the adventure continues with a new adult confirmation class evening course, just four weeks long, just one hour per session, and that starts on the 7th September, and runs for four weeks: It's 6:30 pm to 7:30 pm, and the first one is at : **3 Stream Gardens, Hascombe on 7th September** The other dates are 21st and 28th September and 5th October.
