Knife Angel has symbolic point

A STRIKING sculpture will be displayed at Guildford Cathedral throughout March.

Made from 100,000 seized blades, the thought-provoking Knife Angel aims to inspire social change. It will be on show at the cathedral as part of the UK National Youth Anti-Violence Tour and Programme.

Made by sculptor Alfie Bradley working with the British Ironwork Centre, the angel stands at 27 feet high. The knives were collected from amnesties and seized blades from 43 police forces. It took two years to construct. The angel will be outside the cathedral from

March 1 to 30, and is free to view.

The cathedral is seeking charities or organisations to volunteer to be on site each day to engage, provide information and signpost the visiting public.

It is asking those which provide support for people affected by domestic violence, violence against women and girls, or youth charities to get involved, also giving them the opportunity to highlight their work with a morning or afternoon slot, or more.
