- 1 Main Lane GCB 4H**  
A beautiful open view over Hascombe cricket pitch and the fields beyond. Veggies, flowers, a pond and a lot more. Come and see our cottage garden and enjoy tea and cakes.
- 2 Hambleton Cottage.**  
Main Lane GCB 4H  
With a formal layout at the front transitioning to a more diverse and winding space at the rear. Offers a variety of plants and a small range of pollinators and insect collection.
- 3 Millery Cottage.**  
The Street GCB 4H  
For a different view right into our garden of new hedges. One half bordered by the stream with a large pond. The other half is more formal with planted borders and flower beds.
- 4 Parnes Garden.**  
The Street GCB 4H  
Built in 1800 on a hillside overlooking the pond. A garden of changing levels directed by a running stream. Based on a local legend and a large pond to hold back the pretty planting.
- 5 Fountain Cottage.**  
The Street GCB 4H  
Situated in the heart of our community opposite the street. Hascombe Fountain. Our cottage garden is a blend of old-fashioned flower borders, productive vegetable beds and a water pond. It is a little place of peace.
- 6 Pine Cottage.**  
The Street GCB 4H  
A quiet, sheltered, sunny (W) site, mostly part of a large field. Flanked by mature trees. Mainly day-lilies, perennials, and ornamental grasses & roses.
- 7 High Leys Farm.**  
Hascombe Road GCB 4H  
High on the hillside above the village of Hascombe stands a green oasis of tranquillity. Within the garden is the original residence of the village's first vicar, Archibald Thomson (1800-1880). The planting complements the architecture and the house beautifully.
