- 1 Main Lane GCB 4th**
A beautiful open view over Hascombe cricket pitch and the fields beyond. Veggies, flowers, a pond and a lot more. Come and see our cottage garden and enjoy tea and cakes.
- 2 Hambleton Cottage, The Street GCB 4th**
With a formal layout at the front transitioning to a more diverse and relaxing space at the rear. Offers a variety of plants and a small range of produce and flower collection.
- 3 Millery Cottage, The Street GCB 4th**
For a history in sight! Visit our garden of new babies. One half bordered by the stream with a pond and a small range of plants and flowers. The other half is more formal with planted borders and flower beds.
- 4 Pines Cottage, The Street GCB 4th**
Built in 1800 and situated in Hascombe Hill pond. A garden of changing levels directed by a running stream. Inset vegetable beds and herb beds used to hold back the pretty planting.
- 5 Fountain Cottage, The Street GCB 4th**
Situated in the heart of our community opposite the street. Hascombe Fountain. Our cottage garden is a blend of flower borders, productive vegetable beds and a water pond. It is a little place of peace.
- 6 Pine Cottage, The Street GCB 4th**
A quiet, sheltered garden (1911), mostly part of a stone wall. Flanked by mature trees. Mostly day lilies, pansies, tulips, ornamental grasses & roses.
- 7 High Leys, Hascombe Road GCB 4th**
High on the hillside above the village of Hascombe stands a green oasis of tranquillity. Within the garden is the original nucleus of the wildlife area. Archibald Thomson (1850-1930). The planting complements the trees and the house beautifully.
